No, we have not fallen off the face of the earth; even though that may seem like the case to many of you. We have been back in the US for a little over 2 months now and the reverse culture shock and adjusting back to the way of life here has not been a particularly easy process for us. Returning to the US exhausted, we hit the ground running for the first 6 weeks with a wedding; funeral of close family friend; presenting a workshop at the Disciple Heritage Fellowship national conference; and attending the CMF Furlough Retreat in Indianapolis; physical exams for everyone; Dr. appts for Lynn regarding his eyes and polyps in his right sinuses; and working in a few visits with individual support partners. The girls have spoken to a VBS and a Sunday School class. In between there have been family reunions; getting Crystal ready for and moved in at the University of Illinois; Leslie and Cara settled in at Decatur Christian School; along with all of us getting settled into "our home" in Decatur. Yet, in the midst of all, God is faithful and merciful!

A bit of news from Kenya since we left and prayer requests:

\* the drought relief program continues to go well at the 15 distribution sites to 17,000 people and scholarships made available for 45 secondary students to continue their education. Many continue to hear the gospel message as they collect their food.

\* the Olepishet congregation has almost raised their portion of the amount necessary to begin construction on their church building.

\* Kumpa clinic is nearly completed.

\* Joe Cluff, our teammate, arrived safely in Nairobi last week from his furlough. Please pray for him as he is the only CMF Maasai missionary on the field at present time...the rest of us are stateside.

\* Please continue to pray for the main leaders of the Maasai ministry as they continue the Kingdom work in

Maasailand.
