This book deals with a number of essential doctrines that will enable you to defend the Bible as God’s revealed Word. This is an adventure novel about two antagonists representing opposite poles of ethics and morality. The age-old conflict between God and Satan is played out in this fantasy world. An elven prince is captured by the evil lord Dagon, who has created an army to fulfill his evil designs. The climax of the story is a confrontation of the prince by the Son of Elyah, the God of creation.
